# Online Safety Act

## What is the Online Safety Act?

The Online Safety Act 2023 is a set of laws introduced to protect children and adults online. Ofcom is the regulator for online safety in the UK, responsible for ensuring companies follow the new rules. As part of this role, Ofcom have designed the Children Codes of practice, which came into force in July

2025. The codes outline what all online services likely to be accessed by children must do to protect children online, for example:



- Enforce age limits.
- Protect children from accessing harmful or age-inappropriate content. This includes content relating to self-harm and eating disorders.
- Ensure users can easily report harmful content.

Ofcom has the power to enforce the rules as well as issue fines if companies fail to comply. You can find out more here:

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically get free school meals if they go to school. This is called universal infant free school meals. This is different to benefit-related free school meals and you do not have to apply, but if you receive one of the qualifying benefits, you should still register. This is because it can help raise extra funds for your child's school (called Pupil Premium). This Government funding can help with extra tuition, teaching and after school activities. 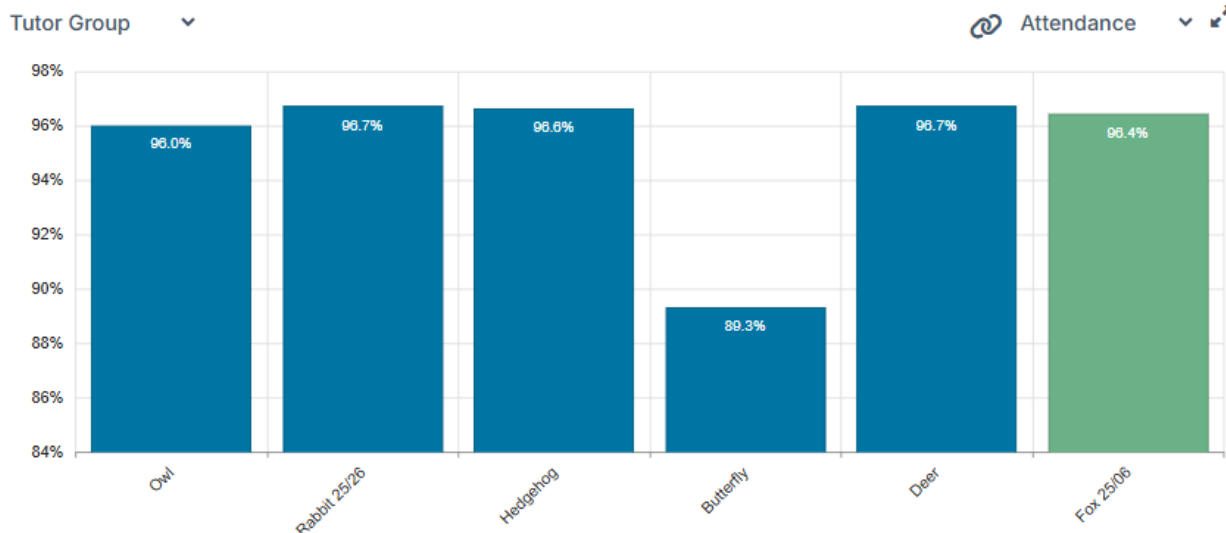

### **Good attendance matters!**

Children in reception, year 1 & 2 should arrive at school at 8.40am and go straight to their classrooms where they will be welcomed by their class teacher.

Children in nursery should arrive at the nursery gate 8.45am where they will be welcomed by their class teacher.

The school gates will close at 8.50am. Any arrivals after this time should come through the main office and will be marked as late.

At the end of the day children should be collected from their classrooms. For nursery children collection is 3.15pm. For children in reception, year 1 & 2 collection is 3.20pm.

For children attending afterschool club (wrap around care) collection is 5.00pm.

### Why Is School Attendance Important?

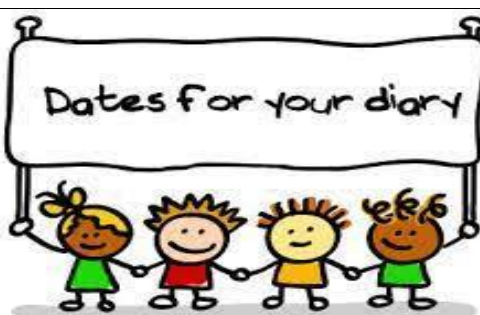
Research has shown that children with good attendance are more than twice as likely to pass their English and Maths GCSEs compared to those whose attendance is below 90%. However if your child's attendance starts to slip the negative affect might increase because;

- It is hard for children to catch up on work missed. This quickly affects their learning and leaves gaps in their understanding.
- It gets in the way of building strong, positive friendships and makes them more at risk of spending time with bad influences.
- It affects exam results and this means they have less choice about further education and careers.
- They miss out on the structure and routines of school which are important practice for adult life.
- They're likely to be less active and not get into healthy habits important for physical and mental wellbeing.
